This letter communicates our findings on the promptness of payments the Department of the Interior made to the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority (DC WASA) for water and sewer services billed during the third quarter (April 1 through June 30, 2007) of fiscal year 2007.

The National Park Service (NPS) pays DC WASA for services to the majority of the parks and NPS facilities within the District of Columbia by electronic transfer of funds through the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Water and sewer services provided along the George Washington Memorial Parkway, for the U.S. Park Police Raleigh Building, 14<sup>th</sup> and Thomas Circle, and within the C&O Canal National Historical Park are paid individually by either check or third party draft directly to DC WASA.

The partial first quarter bill for the U.S. Park Police Raleigh Building, invoices dated November 1, 2006 and December 1, 2006 in the amount of \$5 are still outstanding. Invoices for 14<sup>th</sup> and Thomas Circle in the amount of \$295 are still outstanding.

NPS was timely in its third quarter electronic fund transfer payment of \$381,849. The first quarter 2007 bill for the George Washington Memorial Parkway of \$682 was received in the second quarter of 2007 and paid. The second quarter 2007 bill for the George Washington Memorial Parkway of \$562 was received in the third quarter of 2007 and paid timely.

The partial second quarter bill in the amount of \$5 received for the U.S. Park Police Raleigh Building was paid in a timely manner. The partial third quarter bill in the amount of \$5 received for the U.S. Park Police Raleigh Building was paid in a timely manner.

The first quarter bill for the C&O Canal National Historical Park (Carderock/Great Falls) in the amount of \$5,344 was received in the second quarter of 2007 and paid. The second quarter bill for the C&O Canal National Historical Park (Carderock/Great Falls) in the amount of \$5,761 was received in the third quarter of 2007 and paid in a timely manner.
